iii. Members	Members are called ἐρανισταί, <i>eranistai</i> , ll. 5-6, 9-11.
iv. Officials	Treasurer ( <i>ταμίας</i> , <i>tamias</i> , l. 12). Secretary ( <i>γραμματεύς</i> , <i>grammateus</i> , l. 17). Stewards ( <i>ἐπιμεληταί</i> , <i>epimeletai</i> , ll. 21-22). Hieropoioi ( <i>ἱεροποιοί</i> , <i>hieropoioi</i> , l. 22).
vi. Laws and rules	There is a vague reference to the laws of the <i>eranistai</i> (ll. 5-7: [κατὰ τοὺς νό]μους τοὺς κοινὸς τ[ῶν ἐρανιστῶ]ν, <i>[kata tous no]mous tous koinous t[on eranisto]n</i> ) pertaining probably to the administration of a fund?, ll. 2-5: ὁρθῶ]ς καὶ δικαῖ[ως διεχείρισε τὸ ἀργύριον τ[ὸ] κοινὸν [ν δ παρακατέθεν?] το αὐτῷ οἱ ἐρανιστ[ά---], <i>[ortho]s kai dikai[os diecheirise to ar]gyrion t[o] koinon ho parakatethento autoi hoi eranist[ai]</i> . Equally vague is the reference to an oath in l. 9, κατὰ τὸν ὄρκον δν ὅμοσεν, <i>kata ton horkon hon omosen</i> , sworn by an unknown person, perhaps related to the performance of his duties.

## VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

i. Treasury/Funds	There is a rather vague reference to common funds in ll. 2-5: ὁρθῶ]ς καὶ δικαῖ[ως διεχείρισε τὸ ἀργύριον τ[ὸ] κοινὸν [ν δ παρακατέθεν?] το αὐτῷ οἱ ἐρανιστ[ά---], <i>[ortho]s kai dikai[os diecheirise to argyron t[o] koinon ho parakatethen]to autoi hoi eranist[ai]</i> . The term ἔρανος, <i>eranos</i> in l. 7 may denote a special fund formed by the members' contributions. For a similar case see also IG II <sup>2</sup> 1298, l. 20.

ii. Gender	Men

iii. Age	Adults
iv. Status	One is a foreign resident (metic) exempted from the payment of the particular duty ( <i>metoikion</i> ). The other remains unidentified.

## X. ACTIVITIES

iii. Worship	On the basis of the divinities associated to each <i>hieropoios</i> (ll. 22-24), one may suppose worship by the group.  Deities worshipped Zeus Saviour (Ζεὺς Σωτήρ, <i>Zeus Soter</i> ), ll. 22-23. Herakles (Ἡρακλῆς), l. 23. Saviour (Gods) (Σωτῆρες, <i>Soteres</i> ), ll. 23-24.
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<b>iv. Honours/Other activities</b>	Theon is honoured with a praise (ἐπαινέσαι, epainesai, l. 11) and an olive-leaves crown (θαλλοῦ στέφανον, thallou stephanon, ll. 13-4) because of his zeal (φιλοτιμία, <i>philotimia</i> ) and benevolence (εὐνοία, <i>eunoia</i> ). Similarly Dionysios the secretary is honoured in ll. 16-8. The stewards together with the <i>hieropoioi</i> are praised and honoured in ll. 21-5 for their virtue (ἀρετή, <i>arete</i> ) and zeal (φιλοτιμία, <i>philotimia</i> ).
