i. Assemblies	Meetings were held probably every month, <i>IG II² 1290</i> , ll. 1-2: μηνὸς Ποσιδε [ῶνος ὑστέρου ἔκτη]ει ἵσταμένου, <i>menos Poside[onos hysterou hekt[ei histamenou</i> .
iii. Worship	There is a reference to a celebration of Ἀδώ[v]ia, <i>Adō[n]ia</i> in <i>IG II² 1290</i> , l. 10 and to sacrifices (θυσ[ίαι], <i>thys[iai]</i>) in <i>IG II² 1290</i> , l. 6.
Deities worshipped	Ἀφροδίτη, Aphrodite, <i>IG II² 1290</i> , l. 8. Ἄδωνις, Adonis, <i>IG II² 1290</i> , l. 10.
iv. Honours/Other activities	The association praises (ἐπαινέσαι, <i>epainesai</i>) and bestows a golden crown (χρυσοῦς στέφανος, <i>chrysous stephanos</i>) and the <i>proxenia</i> for his benevolence (εὔνοια, <i>eunoia</i>) towards the members of the group, SEG 52: 135, ll. 5, 9-12.
