i.b. Document(s) typology & language/script	Greek honorary decree for Diodoros, son of Sokrates of Aphidnai, for his performance on his repeated tenure of treasurership, his benefactions and contribution to the well-being of the group. It was approved unanimously.

ii. References to buildings/objects	The precinct (<i>τέμενος, temenos</i> , l. 40) of Soteira. The decree will be inscribed on a stone slab (<i>στήλη λιθίνη, stele lithine</i> , l. 39).
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VII. ORGANIZATION

i. Founder(s)	It has been argued that Diodoros, son of Sokrates, qualified in ll. 10-2 as: <i>γενηθεὶς δ[ὲ] καὶ παραίτιος τῆς ἄνωθεν συλλογῆς καὶ τὴν σύνοδον αὐτὸς κτίσας, genetheis d[e] kai paraitios tes anōthen sylloges kai ten synodon autos ktisas</i> , was the founder of the association (see also l. 42); see GRA I 48.
Gender	Male
iii. Members	The members of the association are called <i>ἐρανισταί, eranistai</i> , l. 26.
iv. Officials	Chief- <i>eranistes</i> (<i>ἀρχερανιστής archeranistes</i> , l. 12-3, 33, 37). Treasurer (<i>ταμίας, tamias</i> , l. 13, 17-8, 20, 22, 36). Priests (<i>ἱερεῖς, hereis</i> , l. 24, 37).
v. Other staff	It seems that the four individuals mentioned in ll. 30-2 were appointed as an ad hoc committee to attribute the honours to Diodoros, ll. 28-30: <i>όμοθυμαδὸν προεβάλετο τοὺς εἰσοίσοντας αὐτοῖς τὰς καθηκούσας τιμάς, homothymadon proebaleto tous eisoisontas autois tas kathekousas timas</i> .

ii. Realty	It is not certain that the association was the owner of the sanctuary (<i>τέμενος, temenos</i> , l. 40) of Soteira.

i. Assemblies	The association held meetings on the sixth of <i>Mounichion</i> (mod. April/May).
Known voting practice	The association voted with votes (lit. pebbles) ψήφοι, <i>psephoi</i> and the result is reported in ll. 44-6: τῶ[ι]ν ψήφον αἷς ἐδόκει τόδε τὸ δόγμα κύριον εἶναι, ἔξηκον[τα] αἷς δὲ οὐκ ἐδόκει οὐδεμία, <i>ton psephon hais edokei tote to dogma kyriion einai, hexekonsta] hais de ouk edokei oudemia</i> .
ii. Meetings and events	Diodoros has organized and financed from his own pocket a feast to the members of the group, ll. 25-7: καὶ ἀφιλαργύρως ιστανόμενος ἡστίασεν τοὺς ἑρανιστάς ἐκ τῶ[ι]ν ιδίων ἀναλόσας οὐκ ὀλίγον χρῆμα, <i>kai aphilargyros histanomenos hestiasen tous eranistas ek ton idion analosas ouk oligon chrema</i> .
iii. Worship	Mention of the priest and temple of Artemis (?) <i>Soteira</i> may suggest worship by the group (ll. 24, 40).
Deities worshipped	(Ἄρτεμις?) <i>Soteira</i> , (<i>Artemis</i>) <i>Soteira</i> (?)
iv. Honours/Other activities	The association praises (ἐπαινέσαι, <i>epainesai</i> , l. 33) and honours Diodoros son of Sokrates with an olive-leaves crown (θαλλοῦ στέφανος, <i>thalou stephanos</i> , l. 34) and an annual proclamation (ἀναγορεύεσθαι, <i>anagoreuesthai</i> , ll. 37-9) of the crown.
