In IG II<sup>2</sup> 1316 the members of the group in the incised crowns on the stele are called θιασῶται, *thisotai*. A lot of ink has been spilled in order to explain this occurrence, for a summary see GRA I 16. The scenario of a scribe's confusion may be the most likely (cf. Ferguson 1994: 110-1), since it is established that a sanctuary could have been used by more than one associations and according to the fresh dating of the documents, *thisotai* association did not precede the *orgeones* one.

#### **Known practice of appointment**

The temple warden in IG II<sup>2</sup> 1328, 21-44 is appointed exceptionally for life by decision of the association. The regular procedure of appointment rested on a decision of the serving priestess to select one of the priestesses who has served previously; it is described in ll. 17-9: καθιστάτω δὲ ἡ ἀεὶ λανχάνουσα ιέρεψ[ια ζάκον]πον ἐκ τῶν ιερειῶν [τ]ῶν γεγενε<>ῶν π[ρ]όστερον, δῆλος δὲ τὴν αὐλὴν [μὴ ἔξει]ναι καταστῆσαι ἔος ὃν ἄπασι διέλθοσιν, *kathistato de he aei lanchanousa hieres[ia zako]pon ek ton hiereion [t]on gegeneion p[ro]stoteron, d[i]s de ten auten [me exei]hai katastesai heos an hapasai dielthosin.*

## vi. Laws and rules

## vii. Judicial system

In case of violation of the above provision, the priestess (*iéreia, hierεia*) will be liable to pay a fine of 50 drachmas, she shall be deprived of the praise, and she shall be removed, IG II<sup>2</sup> 1328, ll. 11-6: [ἐὰν]ν [δέ]παρὰ ταῦτα ποιεῖ, κύριοι ἔ[σ]τωσαν οἱ ὄργεῶνες ζημιοῦντε[ς τὴν]ν [πα]ρ[άρ]βαίνουσά[ν]ν | τι τῶν γεγραμμένων μέχρι δραχμῶν π[εν]τήκοντα καὶ εἰσπραττ[όν]ν τῶν τρόποι δύτωι ἀν [δύνωνται] μὴ δέξενται δὲ μηθενὶ μηδ' ἐπιμηφίσαι | τὸν εἰθισμένον ἔπαινον αὐταῖς· κύριοι δ' ἔστωσαν καὶ τὸ φύλλον τά[ξ]α[ι] | ὑπὲρ τῆς ἀπειθούσης, *[ea]n [d]e para tauta poiei, kyrioi e[s]tosan oi orgeones zemiountes te[n] [p]ar[r]abainousa[n] ti ton gegrinnenon mechri drachmon p[en]tekonta kai eispratt[on]ton tropoi hotoi an [dynontai; m]e exeinai de metheni med' epipsephisai ton eithismenon epaimon autais; kyrioi d' estosan kai to phylon ta[x]a[i] hyper tes apeithouses.*

Also if anyone violates the rule about iteration in the function of *zakoros*, they are going to be liable to the same fine, IG II<sup>2</sup> 1328, ll. 18-9: εἰ δ[έ] μή, ἔν[οχ]ος ἔ[σ]τω | ή ιέρεια τοῖς αὐτοῖς ἐπιτιμίοις, *e[st]o me], en[och]os e[st]o he hierεia tois autois epitimiois.*

## VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

### i. Treasury/Funds

The association had a treasury designated as *koinόν*, *koinon*, IG II<sup>2</sup> 1327, l. 29; IG II<sup>2</sup> 1316, ll. 23-4). The association set up a fund called *ἔρανος*, *eranos* on the initiative of Hermaios son of Hermogenes of Paionidai, IG II<sup>2</sup> 1327, ll. 13-5: καὶ τοῦ ἐράνου τοῦ ἀργυροῦ ἀρχηγὸς γενόμενος συναχθῆναι, *kai tou eranou tou argylerou archegos genomenos synachthenai*.

### ii. Realty

The association perhaps owned a sanctuary which is designated variously as *Μητρῶον* (*Metroon*, IG II<sup>2</sup> 1327, 21. 7), temple (*ναός*, *naos*, IG II<sup>2</sup> 1327, l. 25; IG II<sup>2</sup> 1329, l. 28; IG II<sup>2</sup> 1334, l. 18; IG II<sup>2</sup> 1315, l. 28; IG II<sup>2</sup> 1314, l. 18), *ἱερόν* (*hieron*, IG II<sup>2</sup> 1329, ll. 9, 30; IG II<sup>2</sup> 1334, l. 8; IG II<sup>2</sup> 1316, ll. 9, 21; IG II<sup>2</sup> 1315, l. 15; IG II<sup>2</sup> 1328, l. 20), precinct (*τέμενος*, *temenos*, IG II<sup>2</sup> 1314, ll. 23-4). Ferguson 1944: 113 claimed that the precinct was enclosed by a wall.

### iii. Income

The mentioned income of the group derived mainly from the fines imposed on recalcitrant officials, see above section on judicial system.

In IG II<sup>2</sup> 1316, ll. 12-3 the honoured priestess and her husband are reported to have handed down the income accrued during their term of office: ἀπέδωκαν [δέ] καὶ τὴν π[ρόσοδο]ν [τὴν γενένην ἐφ' αὐτῶν [δικ]αίως, *apedokan [d]e kai[t]en p[rosodo]n [ten ge]nomenen eph' auton [dik]aios*.

Although not strictly an income, individuals like the one honoured in IG II<sup>2</sup> 1329 contributed to the financial health of the association by proposing to cut unnecessary expenses (ll. 10-13: εἰσήνεκεν δὲ καὶ ψηφίσματα ἐπὶ τῷ συνφέροντι ἵνα συνσταλῶσιν αἱ λίαν ἀκαίροι δαπάναι, *eisenenken de kai psephismata epi toi synpheronti hina synstalosin hai lian akairoi dapanai*) and lend money in advance to the group (ll. 16-7: προενχρήστηκεν δὲ καὶ δάφορον | πλεονάκις ὄτοκον ἀποδημούντος τοῦ ταμίου, *proeuchresteken de kai diaphoron pleonakis atokon apodemountos tou tamiou*).

The treasurer in IG II <sup>2</sup> 1327, ll. 18-9 and the secretary in IG II <sup>2</sup> 1329, ll. 24-5 were honoured because of their virtue (ἀρετή, <i>arete</i> ) and piety (εὐσέβεια, <i>eusebeia</i> ). |
