i. **Treasury/Funds**The association must have funds in order to erect an honorific stele such as the one mentioned here, erected at its own expenses (ἐκ τῶν ἰδίων, *ek ton idion*, Herrmann (1996): Il. 14-5)

iv. Honours/Other activities The association erected the honorific stele awarded by the *demos* of Sardis to T. Ioulios Lepidos []genianos, *archiereus* of Asia and of the city. He is 'First of the city', (*protos tes poleos*), because of his ambition of glory and his benevolence towards his fatherland. On the importance of honorific inscriptions set up by private associations in order to commemorate the relationships that they maintained with the leading members of society cf. Nijf 1997: 73

i. Local interaction	The association must have local interaction since it erects an honorific inscription awarded by the city to a benefactor of the city.
