Egnatius Quartus, a man with a distinguished military career, who is also on record in two honorary inscriptions from Akmonēia, his home town (IGR IV 642; SEG 56: 1492). He is said to have been κτίστης, <i>ktistes</i> (l. 12) (of the city), φιλόπατρις, <i>philopatris</i> (l. 13), and εὐεργέτης, <i>euergetes</i> (l. 15), of the association; thus, the reference is twice to the city and once to the association.
