i. Local interaction	The deceased, Baibios Antonios, may be related to Loukios Baibios, a <i>decurio</i> of Kassandreia attested in another inscription found at Hagios Mamas (CIG II 2007c).
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XII. NOTES

i. Comments	The only term used for this association is the term <i>kollegion</i> . Given that the leader of the association is termed <i>archisynagogos</i> of the God Hero, however, we should maybe understand the association's full name as κολλήγιον θεοῦ ἥρωος, <i>kollegion theou heroos</i> , 'the college of (the devotees of) the God Hero'.
