viii. Obligations	The <i>synodos</i> declares that the statue of its benefactor has to be crowned by everyone who performs in the theatre; if he does not, he is to pay to the <i>synodos</i> (ll. 18-20).

Honours/Other activities	The <i>synodos</i> honours an <i>agonothetes</i> , who has not only done his job well, but also feasted the <i>synodos</i> on many occasions (with "royal banquets", l. 16). He receives the "customary inscription" and a statue; furthermore, he is proclaimed as a benefactor in every city where the <i>synodos</i> performs.
