designate a cult-room, but the etymology is unknown (Wachter cautiously refers to Arabic 'aqada, "zusammentreffen").

i.	Comments	The meaning of the designation 'the fifth <i>techne</i> ' in the nomenclature of the couch-makers is unclear. The fifth of all the <i>technai</i> ? Hardly the fifth <i>techne</i> in this particular craft. Wachter 2005: 326 also restores $[\kappa\lambda\iota]vo\pi\eta[\gamma\hat{\omega}v]$, $[kli]nope[gon]$ in another inscription from the sanctuary of Eshmun.
