The papyrus records the sales of various property (presumably) by the state through *praktores xenon*, to various individuals. The passage where the association is mentioned (in the dative case) is fragmentary and the context is not clear: a ship and doum palm wood are mentioned in the two immediately preceding lines. Perhaps the association owned some palm trees, which were sold for various purposes?
