Similarly, in O.Joach. 17, II. 6-7 Petesouchos may have been the <i>oikonomos</i> of the association, given the fact that he is mentioned after the <i>prostates</i> .

iv. Status	If the ed.pr.'s interpretation is correct, and all the people mentioned in these texts were in fact members of the association (the wording καὶ τῶν ἄλλων θιασιτῶν, kai ton allon thiasiton – without any previous reference to the association in the text – in O.Joach. 7, 1. 7-8 and O.Joach. 18, Il. 8-9 seems to point in that direction – in O.Joach. 1 there might be mention of the <i>oikonomos</i> of the association before the wording 'the other <i>thiasitai</i> '), the members included local administrative and religious officials, such as the strategus of the nome, the <i>oikonomos</i> , the <i>epistates</i> of the temple, the official in charge of the taxes and royal scribe, the <i>topogrammateus</i> (some of them bore aulic titulatures, such as <i>syngenes</i>).
