i. Comments	The list contains 11 names, but not in one column, but (moving to the right) 6+2+2+1 (Milik 1972: 123-5; in Cumont's text, the first name is missing). The names are introduced with Μν(ησθη), <i>Mn(esthei)</i> . Milik would again regard this as a "confrérie"; cf. CAPInv. 692 , CAPInv. 679 , CAPInv. 678 , and CAPInv. 694 .
