i.a. Source type(s)	Epigraphic source(s)
i.b. Document(s) typology & language/script	All texts are in Greek. Aneziri no. F2 is an honorific decree issued by the <i>koinon ton Dionyson techniton</i> to honour Skymnos, certainly son of a man previously named in the decree. Aneziri no. F3 is another honorific decree issued by the same <i>koinon</i> to honour Apollodotos son of Leukios. Aneziri no. F1 is an honorific decree probably issued by the same <i>koinon</i> (but in this case it is defined as <i>koinon ton peri [ton Dionyson kai tas Mousas] techniton</i> ) to honour Sosis son of <i>Aris[- -] Syrakosios, proxenos S[- -]</i> .
i.c. Physical format(s)	Aneziri no. F2: rectangular marble stele broken on the right side, at the top and bottom. Aneziri no. F3: rectangular marble stele broken on all sides. Aneziri no. F1: rectangular marble stele broken on all sides; at the top it is possible to see traces of a carved honorific wreath.
ii. Source(s) provenance	Aneziri no. F1: Syracuse, nearby the Saint Lucia's district. Aneziri nos. F1-2: from Syracuse, near the Greek theatre.

ii. References to buildings/objects	A public or religious building is mentioned in the decrees ( <i>Mouseion</i> , <i>Mouseion</i> : Aneziri no. F3, l. 3).

iii. Members	Referred to as <i>τεχνῖται</i> , <i>technitai</i> (Aneziri no. F1, l. 10, <i>in lacuna</i> ; Aneziri no. F2, l. 2; Aneziri no. F3, l. 5, <i>in lacuna</i> ), professionals of theatrical performances.
iv. Officials	Individual officials: <i>ἱερεύς</i> , <i>hiereus</i> (Aneziri no. F1, l. 2); <i>ἄρχων</i> , <i>archon</i> (Aneziri no. F1, l. 4 <i>in lacuna</i> ).

## IX. MEMBERSHIP

v. Relations	The honorand of the first decree (Aneziri no. F2), <i>Skymnos</i> , could be the son of one of the <i>koinon</i> members, maybe the proposer.
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## X. ACTIVITIES

iv. Honours/Other activities	The <i>koinon ton Dionyson (kai Mousas) techniton</i> is attested to have awarded a wreath to Skymnos (Aneziri no. F2, l. 4), Apollodotos son of Leukios (Aneziri no. F3, l. 6 <i>in lacuna</i> ) and maybe to Apollonios (Aneziri no. F1). The honours are justified with reference to: A) the honorand's <i>εὐνοία</i> ( <i>eunoia</i> ) and <i>ἀρετή</i> ( <i>arete</i> ), being an <i>euergetes</i> towards the membership (Aneziri no. F2); B) the honorand's <i>καλοκαγαθία</i> ( <i>kalokagathia</i> ), being <i>euergetes</i> towards the membership (Aneziri no. F3).
