ii. References to buildings/objects	The dedication to the <i>Bakcheion</i> is referred to in the text as a κίων, <i>kion</i> (l. 5).

i.	Number	Undefined; only one (the <i>hiereus</i> ) mentioned by name in the text.
iv.	Status	See above (IV.ii) for the possible ethnic origin of the members.

i. Comments	Bαχχίου 'Ασιανῶν, Bachchiou Asianon, on the stone.  Two bakcheia seem to have existed simultaneously at Nicopolis ad Istrum's territory: one gathering, at least initially, devotees originating from Asia Minor, and one for those designated as 'vernaculi', see CAPInv. 1753.
	For cult associations of Ἀσιανοί, <i>Asianoi</i> , from the Roman provinces of Thracia and Moesia Inferior, see also Dionysopolis (IGBulg I <sup>2</sup> 23), Municipium Montanensium (IGBulg II 480) and Perinthos (I.Perinthos 56) (see <u>CAPInv. 638</u> ); these are designated either as a σπεῖρα, <i>speira</i> , or as a βακχεῖον, <i>bakchion</i> . For neighbouring Macedonia, see <u>CAPInv. 515</u> and an association from Napoca in Dacia, CIL III 870.
