#### VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

ii. Realty The altar dedicated by the *syngeneia* was probably in its possession.

i. Number	Seven members (all male) of the <i>syngeneia</i> are recorded in the last part of the dedication to Theos Preietos (Il. 4-8): Biantion, Damas, Biantion, Moukianos, Sostratos, Theophilos and Sosipatros.
ii. Gender	Men
Note	All recorded members are male.

iii.	Worship	The members of the <i>syngeneia</i> dedicated an altar as a thanksgiving to Theos Preietos, Kybele and Zeus.
	Deities worshipped	Theos Preietos Kybele Zeus
iv.	Honours/Other activities	The members of the <i>syngeneia</i> expressed their gratitude to <i>Theos Preietos</i> possibly for protecting their animals as the formula Θεῷ Πρειέτῳ εὐχαριστήριν κατ'ἐπιταγὴν ὑπὲρ τῶν ζώων ( <i>Theoi Preietoi eucharisterin kat' epitagen hyper ton zoion</i> , Il. 2-3) seems to imply (cf. Θğüt-Polat and Şahin 1985: 111 on Theos Preietos as God of domestic animals). They also seem to have thanked Kybele (1. 9: Εὐχαριστοῦμεν τῆ [Μητρί], <i>Eucharistoumen tei [Metri]</i> ) and possibly Zeus (II. 10-11 as restored by Θğüt-Polat and Şahin 1985: 111, κατ' ἐπιταγὴν ΤΟΕΙ Διεὶ εὐχαριστ[οῦμεν], <i>kat' epitagen TOEI Diei eucharist[oumen]</i> ).



i. Comments	The cost of the altar may indicate the existence of a common treasury of the group, but there is no clear proof for that. The cost may have been covered from <i>ad hoc</i> contributions paid by the members of the <i>syngeneia</i> , listed by name in the final part of the inscription.
