i. Number	Aside from Hermias, 8 other members are listed, thus there are 9 known members of the group in total.
ii. Gender	Men
iv. Status	All members have father's names, and thus are probably citizens.
v. Relations	2-3 of the individuals may be relatives (called Menandros or the sons of Menandros, lines 11-14): Φανίας Μενάνδρου, Μένανδρος Διονυσίου, Θεμιστοκλῆς Μενάνδρου.

iii. Worship	The group of <i>eranistai</i> makes a dedication and appears to honor a single god.
Deities worshipped	Zeus Panamaros
