i.	Comments	Note the parallel with <u>CAPInv. 858</u> . It is not clear whether this is the same or a different <i>eranos</i> . There is another (unpublished) text from Arkesine which also mentions an <i>archeranos</i> (SEG 55: 965; Marangou 2005: 166, no. 449; cf. 178).
