i. Comments	Older eds. (following Newton in GIBM II 377) read [κ]οιν[οῦ] Ἑ]γεσ[τ]ιλειδῶν, [<i>k</i>]oin[ou A]ges[i]leidon (l. 76). Hiller von Gaertringen (in IG XII.5 872) opts for [κ]οιν[οῦ] Ἑ]γεσ[τ]ιλειδῶν, [<i>k</i>]oin[on He]ges[i]leidon, following Bechtel in SGDI 5492. The transaction in which the <i>koinon</i> seems to be involved took place in the month Eleithyaion (IG XII.5 872, l. 75).

If it is indeed a <i>koinon</i> involved in the sale of property, this would find its parallels in CAPInv. 864 , CAPInv. 866 , and CAPInv. 867 . Even so, it is difficult to establish if such a <i>koinon</i> should be considered 'private'. Cf. Ziebarth 1896: 43; Étienne 1990: 42, n. 21.
