On CID IV 164 and F.Delphes III.1 466, *xystarches* is member of a conspicuous family and hold other important offices (*agonothetes*, *hosios?*, secretary, ambassador of the God) in the city (or other cities) and the sanctuary.
It is not certain that the Quintilius Karpophoros from Ephesos was *archigrammateus* of the Delphic *xystos* or the *xystos* in Rome (F.Delphes III.1 209)
