Comments	The <i>xystarches</i> of the inscription had won many athletic competitions, he was granted the citizenship of various cities and the Emperor had named him <i>archiereus</i> (F.Delphes III.1 557, l. 1) of the <i>sympas xystos</i> , <i>xystarches</i> for life and responsible for the baths ( <i>valaneia</i> ) of Sebastoi.
