iii. Members	Members of the group are called συνοδεῖται, l. συνοδῆται <i>synoditai</i> , , l. 19.
iv. Officials	Priest of Melpomenos, ([ἱερ]εὺς Μελπομένου, <i>[hier]eus Melpomenou</i> , l. 12); perhaps he was an official of the group.

## X. ACTIVITIES

iii. Worship	The presence of a priest of Melpomenos, ([ἱερ]εὺς Μελπομένου, <i>[hier]eus Melpomenou</i> , l. 12) may suggest worship.
Deities worshipped	Διόνυσος Μελπόμενος, Dionysos <i>Melpomenos</i> ?

## XIII. EVALUATION

i. Private association	Probable
Note	Although the nomenclature of the group is heavily restored, it is still likely that the inscription comes from a group of <i>peri ton Dionyson technitai</i> . What remains uncertain is whether the group is Athenian or active in the wider Greek world.
