i. Comments	In his commentary to the inscription, D. M. Pippidi suspects that Aba's liberalities conceeded to the τέκτωνες, <i>tektones</i> , might be connected with their role as δενδροφόροι, <i>dendrophoroi</i> (bearers of the sacred tree), during the festivals dedicated to Cybele and Attis. Aba was also a benefactress of the <i>Herakleiastai</i> (CAPInv. 1209), the <i>Taureastai</i> (CAPInv. 1210), and the <i>speira Dionysiaston presbyteron</i> (CAPIny. 1218).
