Note	Inscription found at Mazara del Vallo (first edition Ribezzo 1933, corrected by Segre 1934, full discussion Manni Piraino 1969, republished Brugnone 2003, whence SEG 58: 1047), but the text references Lilybaeum, and many inscriptions from Lilybaeum seem to have been transported to Mazara del Vallo in later times; the text may therefore originally come from Lilybaeum. Consequently, the reference to πατρίδα (<i>patrida</i>) is ambiguous.

Local interaction	Honours, including a crown (image engraved on the stone) at the expense of the <i>koinon</i> (ἐκ τῶν ἰδίων, <i>ek ton idion</i> , ll. 6-7) for Marcus Iunius Felix, <i>bouleutes</i> of Lilybaeum and <i>patron</i> of the <i>koinon</i> , in recognition of his zeal for his hometown (φιλοτειμη σάμενον περὶ τὴν πατρίδα, <i>philoteimesamenon peri ten patrida</i> , ll. 3-5). The inscription ends with the letters ΔΔΒ, <i>DDB</i> in Greek, which may signify δόγματι δεκουριῶνων βουλῆς, <i>dogmati dekourionon boules</i> , and so indicate that the honours from the <i>koinon</i> were also approved by the <i>decuriones</i> of Lilybaeum; but <i>dono dedit benemerentissimo</i> has also been suggested (see Bisi 1969, SEG 58: 1047).

Note	No further information available, and even the nominative form of the genitive κινάκων, <i>kinakon</i> is uncertain, but the nature of the text and its references to the Lilybaeum <i>boule</i> strongly implies a private association of some sort.
