iii. Worship	The nature of the <i>latreia</i> implied in the group's designation is unclear.
Deities worshipped	Sarapis? The inscription begins with a religious formula: "Great is the name of the god" (ll. 1-2). This and the unusual term λατρευταί, <i>latreutai</i> has led to the incorporation of the inscription into the corpora on Egyptian cults (Hölbl 1978: 53; SIRIS 304; RICIS II 304/0613).
