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VII. ORGANIZATION

ii. Leadership	The god Dionysos and the emperor Hadrian.
iii. Members	All of them are <i>technitai</i> (artists).
iv. Officials	<i>archiereus</i> (l. 4): Alexandros of Sardis for the third time. For the identification of this Alexandros with Alexandros son of Sopatos, thrice high-priest who appears as secretary in cf. comment on Sardis VII.1 13, l. 4. <i>agonothetes</i> (l. 15)
viii. Obligations	Celebration of competitions (this is the aim of the whole inscription). In this case without cost to the city (ll. 7 and 14: <i>προῖκα</i> , <i>proika</i>).

X. ACTIVITIES

i. Assemblies	Sardis VII.1 13 is a decree approved by the guild, most probably in an assembly.
ii. Meetings and events	Celebration of artists competitions.
iii. Worship	Celebration of competitions in honor of Dionysos.
Deities worshipped	Dionysos

ii. Interaction abroad	The guild is international and interacts together with different cities in order to celebrate <i>agones</i> .
