IV. NAME AND TERMINOLOGY

ii. Name elements	Theophoric:	Ἀπόλλωνος Στραταγίου, <i>Apollonos Stratagίου</i> - From the god Ἀπόλλων, Apollon (Morrelli, <i>I culti in Rodi</i> [Pisa, 1959], 21-28, 102-110). This is the sole recorded attestation of the epithet Στρατάγιος, <i>Stratagios</i> attributed to Apollon.
Note	The character of the association is greatly reminiscent of other associations described as κοινὸν, <i>koinon</i> , although it is impossible to verify the descriptive term due to erosion.

XII. NOTES

i. Comments	<p>The final line of the inscription has been damaged to a point where the descriptive term of the association is gone. Some scholars have restored the lacuna as <i>eranistai</i> (cf. Wescher, van Gelder). Others have restored it as <i>koinon</i>, which would be consistent with the rest of the inscription (Foucart, Hiller).</p> <p>The name of the association has also been a point of contention. The interpretations mostly see Apollon Stratagios as a cult, yet another interpretation has seen it as a personal name. Either interpretation would be the first of its kind on Rhodes or elsewhere (Morelli, Carratelli, List of Greek Personal Names).</p>
