i. Private association	Possible
Note	Cumont 1923: 204 pointed out the possibility that ἀδελφοί, <i>adelphoi</i> (l. 8), could be used here "au sens religieux de membres d'une même confrérie". This is possible in the light of other building inscriptions from Dura that involve associations, but it cannot be proven.
