iv. Honours/Other activities	The association honors the athlete M. Aurelius Thelymitres, a member of a prominent Milesian family (cf. Milet VI.3, p. 222) who was <i>pythioneikes</i> , <i>kapetolioneikes</i> and <i>periodoneikes</i> . Even though as a successful athlete he was freed from all civic duties, Thelymitres has been a benefactor of his <i>patris</i> . No specific benefactions for the association are mentioned.
