iii. Worship	A statue of Dionysos is offered to the <i>koinon</i> by the priest of Zeus <i>Trophonios</i> and president of the Baccheion. The relation between the <i>koinon</i> and the god remains unclear.

i. Local interaction	The <i>koinon</i> displays links with the priest of Zeus <i>Trophonios</i> who is also the president of the Baccheion, but the exact nature of those relations remains unclear.
