i. Comments	The dedication is dated after the eponymous <i>basileus</i> . The deity of the association is unknown. In Callatis there were <i>thoinetai</i> both of Demeter <i>Chthonia</i> (I. Kallatis 40, possibly also 41 = <u>CAPInv. 1158</u>) and of Herakles <i>Alexikakos</i> (I. Kallatis 68 = <u>CAPInv. 1161</u>): therefore, it is impossible to decide.
