The text does not contain a reference to a *synodos*, *koinon*, or *thiasos*. But the identification of the group as the *laxoi* does suggest that it might have referred to an association as parallels indicate. The reference to a *topos*, more common outside of Egypt, can also indicate the presence of an association.
