Endowments	The association is the recipient of a funerary endowment (<i>stephanotikon</i> ; in Pennacchietti's edition (AAT 101: 317, no. 45), it is qualified as "great", <i>mega</i> , but the Roberts have plausibly argued for a different reading). The coronation of the grave shall take place on the birthday (<i>genethlion</i> , AAT 101: 317, no. 45, l. 8) of the deceased woman's son.

ii. Meetings and events	The association was entrusted with taking care of a grave.
iv. Honours/Other activities	Altertümer von Hierapolis 40 is an honorific decree for a man who had served as <i>strategos</i> , <i>agonothetes</i> , <i>grammateus</i> (Altertümer von Hierapolis 40, ll. 6-7) of the temples of Asia, <i>presbeutes</i> and <i>archiereus</i> (Altertümer von Hierapolis 40, ll. 12-14; he is described as a "benefactor of the homeland").

i. Local interaction	The association honors the same person as do the <i>porphyrabaphoi</i> (Altertümer von Hierapolis 41); both associations use the same wording.

Note	Professional associations in the 2nd/3rd century were often very close to the official civic institutions, but they probably remained essentially private associations.
