## XI. INTERACTION

### i. Local interaction

P.Mich. II 123 recto, col. III, l. 40: Coordination with the association of *apolysimoi* ([CAPInv. 1409](#)), perhaps on a contractual basis, with whom the *probatoktenotrophoi* have paid for the preparation of a declaration; P.Mich. II 123 recto, col. VIII, l. 26: declaration of the *apolysimoi* and the *probatoktenotrophoi* for guarding runnels/water channels.

## XII. NOTES

### i. Comments

Payment made to the grapheion of 11 drachmas for the preparation of a declaration along with the *apolysimoi* at a cost of 11 drachmas; declaration for guarding runnels prepared free of charge. The *probatoktenotrophoi* mentioned in P.Mich. II 121 recto 4 xii (with P.Mich. II 121 verso III l. 18) (AD 42) may belong to this group. The *probatoktenotrophoi* of Neiloupolis appeared active as an association at Soknopaiou Nesos in the Fayum: [CAPInv. 1244](#).
