On the basis of the presence of the genitive of the proper name Demotes in the nomenclature of the group, perhaps Demotes (*Athenian Onomasticon* s.v. (1)) was the leader.

On the basis of the genitive Δημότο (*Demoto*) a date in the mid 4th century BC is more likely, Threatte 1996: ii 150-4.
