i. C	omments	This is the first association of <i>mageiroi</i> in the Greek world. The closest parallels are a τέχνη τῶν μακελλαρίων, <i>techne ton makellarion</i> at Perinthus (see <u>CAPInv 532</u> ), and the <i>Onitadai</i> of Miletus (see <u>CAPInv 1046</u> ). See Marchand 2015. Their roles could have been multiple: <i>mageiroi</i> were butchers, cooks, and performed sacrifices (see Rankin 1907 and Berthiaume 1982).
