iii. Members	Nine members of the <i>hetaireia</i> , who contributed to the dedication, are listed at the end of the inscription: C. Iulius, son of Artabanas, Athenodoros, son of Megistanos, Wambaissasis, son of Tarkondimotos, Motadas, son of Wanawarbasis, Iulius, son of Liabeitis, Phandedis, son of Liwasis, Antonius, son of Ginatis, Antonius, son of Antonius, also called Koulis, Iulius, son of Tarkondimotos

IX. MEMBERSHIP

i. Number	Nine men are listed in the inscription. It is not clear, if the <i>hetaireia</i> counted more members.
ii. Gender	Men

X. ACTIVITIES

iii. Worship	The association dedicated a καθέδρα, <i>kathedra</i> (l. 2) (a 'seat' or 'throne', Pleket in SEG 54: 1481) to Kronos.
Deities worshipped	Kronos

XII. NOTES

i. Comments	The inscription is dated in the year 129 (era of Anazarbos) = 110 AD.
