ii. Name elements	Cultic:	The name element <i>Soteriastai</i> is derived from <i>soter</i> , an epithet shared by several gods but is mostly used of Zeus, on Rhodes particularly for the cult of Zeus Soter, see, e.g., Διοσσωτηριασταί, <i>Diossoteriastai</i> (Maiuri, NSER 28), cf. D. Morelli, <i>I culti in Rodi</i> . SCO 8. Pisa 1959: 51-52.
	Heroic:	On the possibility that ἀρχαγέτας, <i>archagetas</i> here is reference to a hero title, see below.
	Personal:	From the Personal name Aphrodisios/Aphrodisia, see <i>LGPN</i> I: s.v. Here, the name Aphrodisios is part of a formula which is seen used in the names of several Rhodian <i>koina</i> : τῶν σὺν + personal name, presumably to indicate the founder or reformator of the association: F. Poland, <i>Geschichte des griechischen Vereinswesens</i> , Leipzig 1909: 75-76. In our case, this sense is reinforced by the addition of the word ἀρχαγέτας / ἀρχηγέτης, <i>archagetas/archegetes</i> , ('leader', 'originator', 'founder'). It was a functional title of heroes and an epiclesis of Apollo and Heracles: F. Graf, s.v. <i>archegetes</i> , in: H. Hancik and H. Schneider (eds.), <i>Brill's New Pauly, Antiquity Volumes</i> (consulted online 12 May 2020).
	Theophoric:	In the ed.pr. the formula is given as τοὶ σὺν (instead of the correct τῶν σὺν) + personal name; as Maiuri notes, the reading of line 2 is insecure.

VII. ORGANIZATION

i. Founder(s)	The individual named Aphrodisios, and who is called ἀρχαγέτας, <i>archagetas</i> , is most probably the founder and leader of the association. This is corroborated by the appearance of his name in the formula τῶν σὺν Ἀφροδισίῳι ἀρχαγέται, <i>ton syn Aphrodisioi archagetai</i> .
