CAPInv. 2012 and CAPInv. 2013) Ἀφροδισιασταί, <i>Aphrodisiastai</i> , l. 23 - From the goddess Aphrodite (Morrelli, <i>I culti in Rodi</i> [Pisa, 1959], 34-35, 117-18). ἀλικιωταί, <i>Halikiotai</i> : A doric plural derived from the word ἡλικιώτης, <i>Helikotes</i> , which, according to LSJ, means; 1) an equal in age, 2) a fellow, or 3) a comrade.
