ii. Name elements	Personal:	Μενεκρατείων τῶν σὺν Μενεκράτει, <i>Menekrateion ton syn Menekratei</i> - From the Greek personal name Μενεκράτης, Menekrates (<i>LGPN</i> s.v. no. 79). The association carried the name of Menekrates, who was also its leader.
	Theophoric:	Ἄριστοβουλιασταί, <i>Aristobouliastai</i> - From the epithet of the goddess Artemis (Morrelli, <i>I culti in Rodi</i> [Pisa, 1959], 28-33, 112-15).
		Σωτηριασταί, <i>Soteriastai</i> - Most likely from the epithet of Zeus (Morrelli, <i>I culti in Rodi</i> [Pisa, 1959], 45-52, 136-47).
		Ἡφαιστιασταί, <i>Hephaistiastai</i> - From the god Hephaistos (Morrelli, <i>I culti in Rodi</i> [Pisa, 1959], 56, 151).
		Ἀγαθοδαιμονιασταί, <i>Agathodaimoniastai</i> - From the hellenistic divinity Ἀγαθός Δαιμόνιον, <i>Agathos Daimon</i> (Morrelli, <i>I culti in Rodi</i> [Pisa, 1959], 2, 77-79).
