	Other:	The left side of the inscription is fragmented. The association possibly carried additional name elements, that are now lost.
Note	The character of the association is greatly reminiscent of other associations described as κοινὸν, <i>koinon</i> , although the descriptive term has been omitted in this case. It is possible that the association was described as a <i>koinon</i> in the fragmented part of the inscription.
