For Blinkenberg's view that after 42 BC such associations of strateuomenoi lost entirely their military character, see Gabrielsen 1997, 203 n. 55. ἐν τριημιολία ᾧ ὄνομα Εἰρήνα, <i>en triemiolia hai onoma Eirena</i> - This name element is a reference to the <i>trihemiolia</i> (a warship) that the association served on.
Note	The character of the association is greatly reminiscent of other associations described as κοινὸν, <i>koinon</i> , although the descriptive term has been omitted in this case.
