i.b. Document(s) typology & language/script	Three successively issued Greek honorific decrees for Stephanos son of Mylothros, breast-plate maker (θωρακοποιός, <i>thorakopoios</i> ), l. 3.
i.c. Physical format(s)	Marble stele measuring 1,25x0,33m.
ii. Source(s) provenance	Found in Piraeus, Alkibiadou str. near the ruins of a sanctuary of Aphrodite, then in possession of Al. Meletopoulos. Now in the Piraeus Museum 2175.

ii. References to buildings/objects	In the inscription there is a reference to a dedication (ἀνάθημα, <i>anathema</i> , l. 51) and to a sanctuary (ἱερόν, <i>hieron</i> , l. 51-52)

iii. Members	Members are called θιασώται, <i>thiasotai</i> , ll. 2, 11, 23, 26, 35, 42, 47-48, 55.
iv. Officials	Steward (ἐπιμελητής, <i>epimeletes</i> , ll. 3-4, 27). <i>Hieropoios</i> (ἱεροποιός, <i>hieropoios</i> , ll. 28, 45-46).

## VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

i. Treasury/Funds	The term κοινόν, <i>koinon</i> in l. 50: δοῦναι αὐτῷ ἀπὸ τοῦ κοινοῦ, <i>dounai autoi apo tou koinou</i> means the treasury.

iii. Age	Adults

## X. ACTIVITIES

iii. Worship	The association organized a procession ( <i>πομπή, pompe</i> , l. 9) during the festival of Adonia, performed a sacrifice ( <i>θυσία, thysia</i> , ll. 31-32, 46-47) to Aphrodite.
Deities worshipped	In the inscription there are references to Ἀφροδίτη, <i>Aphrodite</i> (l. 22, 41, 47) and Ἄδωνις, <i>Adonis</i> (l. 9).
iv. Honours/Other activities	The association honoured Stephanos with a praise (ἐπαινέσαι, <i>epainesai</i> , ll. 11-12, 35-36, 48) and awarded an olive-leaves crown (θαλλοῦ στέφανος, <i>thallou stephanos</i> , ll. 15-16, 39-40, 49) to the honorand in each decree. It also granted an amount of money to erect a dedication (ἀνάθημα, <i>anathema</i> , ll. 16, 40). The text of the dedication is preserved in ll. 17-21: στεφανωθεὶς ὑπὸ τοῦ κοινοῦ ἀνέθηκε τὴν Δῆμητρα Ὁμόνοιαν τοῦ κοινοῦ (l. κοινοῦ) ( <i>stephanotheis hypo tou koinou anetheke ten Demetra Homonoian tou koinou</i> ).

## XII. NOTES

i. Comments	The decrees in the inscription are dated in the archonships of Nikokles, Klearchos, Hegemachos respectively. Mikalson 1998: 143 associates this group with the Kitian traders of IG II <sup>2</sup> 337 ( <a href="#">CAPIv. 295</a> ), probably on the basis of Aphrodite worshipped and the provenance of both inscriptions, and with IG II <sup>3</sup> (4) (3) 1815 = IG II <sup>2</sup> 4985 ( <a href="#">CAPIv. 574</a> ).
