iii. Worship	There are references to sacrifices (θυσίαι, <i>thysiai</i> , IG II ² 1317, l. 3; IG II ² 1317b, l. 5; SEG 2: 10, 5).
Deities worshipped	Βενδῖς, <i>Bendis</i> , IG II ² 1317, l. 11; IG II ² 1317b, l. 9.
iv. Honours/Other activities	The magistrates are honoured with an olive-leaves crown (θαλλοῦ στέφανος, <i>thallou stephanos</i> , IG II ² 1317, l. 6; SEG 2: 10, l. 9) and a praise (ἐπαινέσαι, <i>epainesai</i> , IG II ² 1317, l. 5; IG II ² 1317b, l. 6; SEG 2: 10, l. 8), because of their virtue (ἀρετή, <i>arete</i>) and righteousness (δικαιοσύνη, <i>dikaiosyne</i>), IG II ² 1317, ll. 6-7; SEG 2: 10, l. 9).
