Note	<i>koinon</i> : Petrakos, Δήμος τοῦ Ραμνοῦντος, 167, ll. 9, 28 <i>synodos</i> : Petrakos, Δήμος τοῦ Ραμνοῦντος, 167, l. 2 In ll. 1-2 we read: ἐπειδὴ Διοκλῆς συνῆ χε τῷ Ἀμφιαράῳ σύνοδον, <i>epeide Diokles syneche toi Amphiaraoi synodon</i> ; perhaps <i>synodos</i> does not refer to an association but to the group of worshippers.

i.b. Document(s) typology & language/script	Decision of the group to raise funds through voluntary contributions of its members to financing the rebuilding of certain parts of the sanctuary and to list all the contributors. In the same decision the group decided to honour the officials for their rightneoussness and generosity. Written in Greek.
i.c. Physical format(s)	Marble pedimental stele with crowns depicted at the bottom, broken in two, measuring 1.26x0.45-49m.

VI. BUILT AND VISUAL SPACE

ii. References to buildings/objects	Reference to a sanctuary (ἱερόν, <i>hieron</i> , ll. 2, 10, 12, 15), a house (οἶκος, <i>oikos</i> , l. 3) requiring repairs, roof tiles (κέραμος, <i>keramos</i> , l. 3) and the table (τράπεζα, <i>trapeza</i> , l. 5) being broken, and the portico (προστώιον, <i>prostoion</i> , l. 6) about to collapse, ll. 2-6.
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VII. ORGANIZATION

ii. Leadership	Perhaps, the chief- <i>eranistes</i> (ἀρχερανιστής, <i>archeranistes</i>) Diokles is the leading figure of the group, since he was instrumental in gathering the <i>Amphieraistai</i> (ll. 1-2).
iv. Officials	Secretary (γραμματεὺς, <i>grammateus</i> , l. 22) Treasurer (ταμίας, <i>tamias</i> , l. 23)

VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

ii. Realty	The association perhaps owned the sanctuary, the house (οἶκος, <i>oikos</i> , l. 3) attached to it required repairs.
iv. Endowments	Onesimides of Rhamnous donated income (of unknown origin) to the association in order to perform annual sacrifices, ll. 18-20: καὶ δέδωκε τὴν πρόσδοον τοῖς Ἀμφιεραῖσταῖς τοῖς μετὰ Διοκλέου Ἀμαξαντέως, καὶ θύειν κατ' ἐνιαυτὸν ἀπὸ τῆς προ σόδου τῆς γινομένης, <i>kai dedoke ten prosodon tois Amphieraistais tois meta Diokleou Hamaxanteos, kai thuein kat' eniauton apo tes prosodou tes ginomenes</i> .

i. Number	Twenty-three members are recorded.
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ii. Gender	Men
Note	The list of twenty-three name includes male names only.
iii. Age	Adults
iv. Status	Citizen: 22 Foreigner: 1
v. Relations	Perhaps Θεότιμος Ῥαμνούσιος (Teotimos from Rhamnous) and Θεογένης Ῥαμνούσιος (Theogenes from Rhamnous) mentioned in Il. 38-39 are brothers.

X. ACTIVITIES

iii. Worship	The association performed annual sacrifices, θύειν κατ' ἐνιαυτόν, <i>thuein kat' eniauton</i> , Il. 19-20.
Deities worshipped	Ἀμφιάραος, <i>Amphiaraos</i>
iv. Honours/Other activities	The chief- <i>eranistes</i> and the magistrates are praised (ἐπαινέσαι, <i>epainesai</i> , Il. 15, 21) and crowned with an olive-leaves crown (στεφανῶσαι καὶ τούτων ἕκαστον θαλλοῦ στεφάνοι, <i>stephanosai kai touton hekaston thallou stephanoi</i> , l. 24). Similar honours are granted to Onesimides of Rhamnous for the donation of land and its income for performing sacrifices, l. 16.
