iv. Status

The Timapolis after whom this association is named is probably identical with the Timapolis who makes a contribution to a subscription (*epidosis*) together with the *Athanaista[n] Timapoleion koinon* and also with 5 other associations (I.Lindos II 252, Il. 250-58). Moreover, this Timapolis is either one of the two or perhaps four persons with that name (all of them of the Lindian deme *Kamyndioi*) in the same document (I.Lindos II 252, Il. 34, 39, 86 and 89; see also Blinkenberg's comments ad loc.

In the subscription list I.Lindos II 252, Il. 222-27, this association is listed as making a contribution together with two Lindian citizens, Agathostratos son of Aghathokles Lindopolitas and Nikostratos son of Archokrates Ladarmios.

XI. INTERACTION

i. Local interaction

The Athanaista[n] Timapoleion koinon appears as one of the contributors to a subscription (epidosis) canvased by the Lindian assembly. The association contributes jointly together with two Lindian citizens, Agathostratos son of Agathokles Lindopolitas and Nikostratos son of Archokrates Ladarmios. All three pay the sum of 20 drachmas; the contribution of Nikostratos seems to have been made also on behalf of the Lindian archierothytas, hiereis and hierothytai. The total sum collected was to be used for paying for the golden wreaths that the Lindians dedicated to Athana Lindia, Zeus Polieus and Nike. The list of contributors includes individuals (all of them Lindian demesmen) and and a number of associations. Six of these associations contribute together with Timapolis, while two of them carry his name: the Athanaista[n] Timapoleion koinon of the present entry and the Timapoleion ko[in]on (ibid. 1. 250).
