i.b. Document(s) typology & language/script	Dedication in Greek of a <i>xoanon</i> by M. Valerius Aelius Priscinus to the <i>bakcheion</i> .
i.c. Physical format(s)	Base of a marble statuary group of which only the lower part is preserved; it originally depicted Dionysos in a central position, with his companions (according to SEG 37: 601) or with a tree trunk and a vine branch around it (according to BE 1989: no. 126).

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XIII. EVALUATION

i. Private association	Possible
Note	Due to the limited information offered by the text, it is not clear whether the term βακχεῖον, <i>bakcheion</i> should be interpreted here as referring to a Dionysiac cult association, to the place where such cult rituals were taking place (LSJ, s.v. βακχεῖον 2b = τελεστήριον, <i>telesterion</i>) or to Dionysos' cult epithet (thus Jaccottet 2003: 103: either a dedication to a dionysiac association or a dedication to Dionysos <i>Bakkheios</i>). The same uncertainty surrounds the term ἱερὴ βακχίον, <i>hierie Bakchiou</i> occurring in a funerary inscription from Topeiros, see I.Thrac.Aeg. E93.
