Milik 1972: 131-2 considers the possibility that it was a <i>thiasos</i> , but is more skeptical here than in other cases, because the group would be larger than a normal Semitic <i>thiasos</i> (that would, according to Milik, consist of 10 or 12 men). Cf. his discussion of other lists from the same temple, not included in this inventory, on p. 133-4.
