VII. ORGANIZATION

iii. Members	The members are referred to as οἱ ἐκ τοῦ ἐν Σ<υ>ήνηι Διοσκουριακοῦ θιάσου, <i>hoi ek tou en Syenei Dioskouriakou thiasou</i> (ll. 3-4).
iv. Officials	The association had an οἰκονομῶν, <i>oikonomon</i> (l. 2), named Thrakidas, son of Hierax, who was also <i>strategos</i> of the nome.

VIII. PROPERTY AND POSSESSIONS

ii. Realty	The association owned corn-land in Ser (ll. 7-9: τῆς ὑπαρχούσης γῆς σι[το]φόρου ἐν Σῆρ τῷ προγεγ[ραμ]μένῳ θιάσῳ, <i>tes hyparchouses ges sitophorou en Ser to progegrammeno thiaso</i>), which was let to Bienchis, son of Pates, and his associates (l. 6: μέτοχοι, <i>metochoi</i>).
iii. Income	The association received rent for the land leased. The rent was paid in kind (l. 6-7: μεμετρή κατε). The amount paid is lost in lacuna.

IX. MEMBERSHIP

ii. Gender	Men
Note	Only one member, the <i>oikonomon</i> , is recorded: he was a man.
iv. Status	Thrakidas, son of Hierax, <i>oikonomon</i> of the association, was also <i>strategos</i> of the nome (ll. 1-2).
vi. Proper names and physical features	Θρακίδας Ἰέρακος στρατ(ηγός) καὶ οἰκονομῶν

i. Comments	There is no evidence to maintain any connection between this association and the third-century BC <i>synbasilistai kai Dioskouristai</i> (CAPInv. 606).
