VI. BUILT AND VISUAL SPACE

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| i. Archaeological remains | The inscribed block was found in an underground space along with many marble architectural elements (columns, capitals, bases of statues, etc.) of a great building complex, surely part of the Puteolan theater. Presumably the place was either the <i>schola</i> or the <i>sacellum</i> of the <i>collegium</i> , where the <i>tibicines</i> held their meetings (see. Bollmann 1998: 371-3, no. A53; cf. Camodeca 2011: 210, n. 49). |

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| i. Comments | The supposed <i>schola</i> or <i>sacellum</i> of the <i>tibicines</i> served as collegial meeting place for events like banquets, commemorative celebrations, cultic activities, etc. organized by the association. |
