<b>iv. Status</b>	One of the members is called [φ]ιλότε[ιμος], [ <i>ph</i> ]ilote[imos] (I.Tomis 25, l. 1). Three pontarchs (of the West Pontic community) were members (I.Tomis 25, ll. 4-6).

<b>i. Private association</b>	Probable
<b>Note</b>	The presence of the [φ]ιλότε[ιμος], [ <i>ph</i> ]ilote[imos] (as in other similar cases in Tomis) and of the pontarchs invites us to suspect a private associations.
